

Princeton Elm

(Ulmus americana 'Princeton')

Mature Height: 50'-70'

Mature Spread: 30'-50'

Growth Rate: Fast

Fall color: Yellow

USDA Hardiness zone: 3-9

Princeton Elm is a native elm variety that is resistant to Dutch Elm disease. It is a fast-growing, large shade tree that will grow well in a wide variety of soils and environments. As a young tree, it has a rounded crown that spreads and becomes vase-shaped as it matures. It makes a great shade tree for medium to large yards and for park settings. It is tolerant of air pollution, making it a good choice for urban settings. It will also tolerate some degree of shade, requiring only 4-6 hours of direct sunlight each day.
