The Shingle Oak is a member of the red oak family and has a unique leaf compared to most other oaks. They are elongated and rounded, with smooth edges. The shingle oak is a low maintenance tree with some resistance to the



most common oak diseases. It is drought tolerant and once established, will grow quickly if it receives plenty of water. The acorns are a favorite of wildlife. The leaves can persist throughout the winter providing shelter for birds and other wildlife.
