Concolor Fir

(Abies concolor)

Mature Height: 40'-60'

Mature Spread: 15'-25'

Growth Rate: Slow-mod.

Also known as White Fir, this tree has beautiful blue-green coloring. It grows in a variety of soils, but does not do well with saturated soils. It tolerates alkaline soils better than most conifers. It grows best in full sun, but will tolerate a moderate degree of shade. One of the few true firs that will grow well in the Midwest, it makes both an excellent windbreak and specimen tree. They can be difficult to transplant, but once re-established, they are a hardy tree. They provide



good cover for wildlife, and the seeds are a popular food source for birds and squirrels. Due to the lighter color of the needles, it makes an excellent contrast to the darker greens of the pines and spruces.
