

Taylor Juniper

(Juniperus virginiana "Taylor")

Mature Height: 15'-20'

Mature Spread: 3'-4'

Growth Rate: Fast

The Taylor Juniper was originally discovered near Taylor, Nebraska in 1978 as a variation of the eastern red cedar that is common in the area. It is narrower and more dense than typical of the species. It makes a wonderful accent plant as it can be planted fairly close to structures without growing into them. It is extremely hardy and grows in nearly any soil. Another great attribute is that it seems to be more resistant to cedar apple rust than the rest



of the species. It's foliage becomes silver-green as the tree matures. They are attractive to birds as a nesting site. Due to be native to Nebraska, it is well-adapted to variations in weather. It will do best in full sun, but can tolerate shade for part of the day.
