Eastern White Pine

(Pinus strobus)

Mature Height: 50'-80'

Mature Spread: 20'-40'

Growth Rate: Fast

White Pine makes both a beautiful specimen tree and a wonderful windbreak. The needles are long and soft with a bluish tint. It does tend to get a windswept look if planted in an area of high winds. The old, inner needles turn brilliant yellow in the fall and drop. It does better in acidic soils and can turn yellow if the



pH becomes too alkaline. White pine is an excellent choice for inner rows of a windbreak. It has been prized in the Midwest for many years for its beauty and grace. It is arguably the most ornamental of all of the large pines and the soft, feathery look of the long, soft needles make a contrast to the shorter-needled and darker spruces in the landscape.
